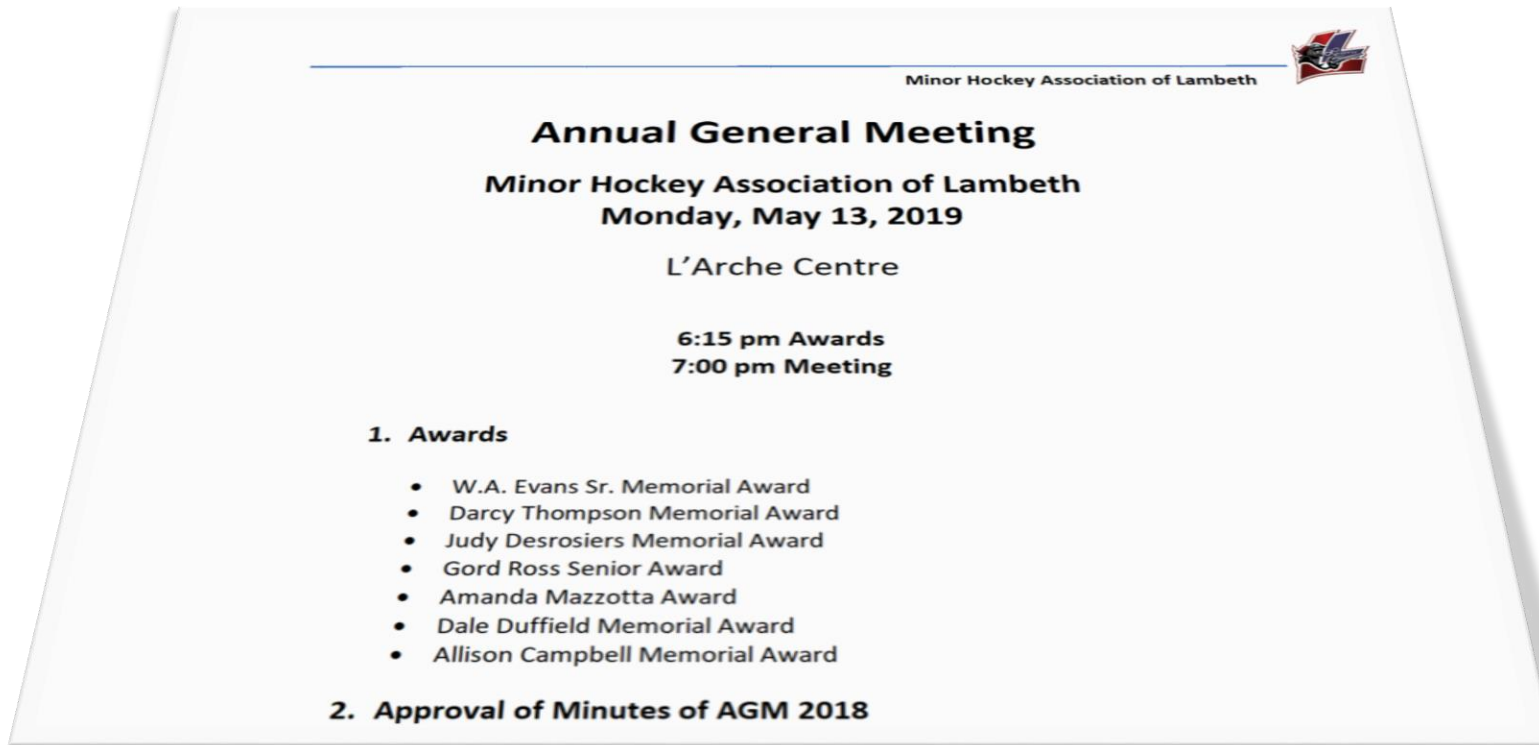

# President Remarks

## President's AGM Report for the 2019-2020 Season

Thanks to everyone that helped make Lambeth Minor Hockey a success this season! This past season the Minor Hockey Association of Lambeth (MHAL) had over 400 players within our Initiation Program, 17 Boys' teams and 7 Girls' teams. These teams could not have happened without countless volunteer hours from our coaches, trainers, managers, convenors, and executive. Thanks to parents for the many logged kilometers driving your children to practices and games. To the players, thank you for all your hard work and representing Lambeth so well!

This season ended very abruptly and it was so heart breaking to not be able to complete playoffs, championships, and year end tournaments. The Boys' Peewee B team was set to compete for the OMHA title and capture the cup and red hats. For girls' hockey, the Bantam B, Midget C and Midget B teams had qualified for Provincials. MHAL was also scheduled to host the Shamrock Novice B year end championship. All players did not have the opportunity to take that final skate as a team and say good bye to the season with a year-end team party. It was most definitely an historic end to a hockey season.



# President Remarks

Hockey will have a different face when we return. Hockey Canada has already cancelled all tournaments for 2020-2021 season. Tournaments are always a highlight of every player's season, making this first announcement a difficult one to hear. At this point, we do not have a start date and have not been given any parameters as to how the season will be structured. As an Executive, we have been taking directions from OMHA and making potential plans based on different possible scenarios. # Ice Report

## Ice Convenor Report 2019-20

During the 2019-20 season, MHAL averaged 60.5 hours of ice per week (25 teams including the IP program). Try Out/ Pre-season ice consisted of 195 hours from September 3 – September 27, 2019. This overall was an increase of usage versus 172 hours last season. No Harvest fest this season we were able to secure start early this season.

We were able to stay flat with our ice allocation versus LY. We also had 3 less teams. We were able to accommodate majority of teams having a solo practice + shared practice. Ice was used at Nichols Arena & Farquharson Arena & Bostwick to accommodate extra practices.

Challenges we had this year were balancing the LL teams + Rep + Girls teams at the “away” arenas. Other opportunity was Local League + Girls Play Off Scheduling. Very challenging to give coaches the ice time and get games booked in a timely fashion.

Below, you will find other points around Ice.

- Total cost of Ice for MHAL was \$304,286.99 (Sept Ice + Winter Ice)
- September Ice \$38,670 vs. September 2018 \$31,097.60
- Winter Ice (October-March) \$265,616.39
- Cost of Ice/hour was \$175.50 + tax versus LY of \$172.38 +tax
- Expected 1% Increase for 2020-21 Ice will be \$177.50/hour
- We returned 40 hours of ice this season (\$5720.62 savings)
- Burned 13 hours of ice this year (due to end of year + March break)
- Communication with Coaches was fantastic
- Teams booking late tournaments posed a challenge for Playoffs

- Several teams asked me to avoid March Break scheduling (very difficult)
- Tyke Half-Ice was successful but will need more attention in 2019-2020 season
- 7:00am Ice continues to be a struggle for participation

Lastly, we will have major hurdle in upcoming season if COVID-19 Protocols take flight. I am currently unsure but we need to plan for sanitization & cleaning from city. May come with increased cost. Example, we may need 3 hours of ice to get 2 one hour practices completed.

MHAL has continued to put in a request that all FARQ ice we secured this year be transferred to Nichols/Bostwick only with weekday ice allocation only.

# Initiation Program Report

The Initiation Program has yet again been an overly positive experience and a strong foundation for coaches and players alike. Unique to IP, we had 11 new coaches & trainers that we were able to recruit and receive certification. All 11 of those parent volunteers should remain within the IP program for next season.

In addition, the continuation of returning parent coaches has been tremendous and without the dedication and massive time commitment of both Ryan Marcy (Jr) and Jay Legault (Sr), who led all practice planning through the entire season, the program could not have been as successful.

## Highlights

- Four “original six” teams in the Senior IP division, and four “original six” teams in the Junior IP division. “Draft night” as always was an exciting event as players found out what team they would be on for the season.
- Able to equally divide all IP players into the two divisions, into equal teams.
- Very excited to have acquired a 9am timeslot on Sundays, which meant a single 7am slot every two weeks per family. Extremely well received for those returning families.
- Quickly assembled certified coaches/trainer per team.
- Following evaluations, we opted to place 5 Sr age players in the Jr division in hopes of "moving them up" as they developed. We were able to give half of those players spots in the Sr division half way through the year, and gave the others the opportunity to play multiple games at the Sr level.
- Number of kids per team (9-10) was ideal, generally allowing 4 vs. 4 games.
- Overall registration level was at capacity
- Designed practices based on Hockey Canada stations; practice groups/hours were run by Ryan Marcy (Jr IP) and Jay Legault (Sr IP), respectively.
- IP Day at Bud Gardens was a fun evening, with two on-ice games followed by attending the London Knights game.
- Significant improvement/development in kids due to a combination of practice/games.
- Overall Communication with coaches/parents was very healthy & no concerns to address.
- Santa Clause once again made an appearance on the ice leading into the holidays - the kids (especially the Jr group) were ecstatic.
- A lot of planning and excitement went into the IP Jamboree that was unfortunately cancelled just days before due to Covid-19.
  - We had seven outside teams registered to participate
- Players have not received year end medals and player gifts from Tim Hortons.

The season was a lot of fun and we saw an extensive amount of development in every single player. Thank you to the volunteers, the parents and the kids for participating.

## **Upcoming 2020-2021 Season U11 Player Pathway**

This pathway is an important component in the transition from U9 hockey and serves as a bridge into U11 hockey. The U11 Player Pathway consists of four phases of instruction, designed for players graduating from U9 hockey. The curriculum introduces, develops and refines the skills of skating, passing, puck control and shooting in a progressive step-by-step manner.

## **Top Feedback from MHAL Parent Survey-Less than 25 completed**

- I. Excellent experience from parents and players having non-parent coaches on Bantam B
- II. Coaching that lacks skills development, lack of non-parent coaching with mentoring, encourage outside instruction
- III. Cleanliness of the arena and lack of concession.



# Girls Hockey Report

The Lambeth girls had another very successful season in 2019/20 before the stoppage. We fielded 7 teams total with 114 young female hockey players.

- The Novice girls started their season under the new half-ice format before transitioning to full ice in mid January. They played 20 full ice games and had a very impressive 16 wins, 3 ties and only one loss in that span. They got to end season on a high note beating St.Mary's 5-1 on the Budweiser Gardens stage. Everyone had fun and improved. They had a very successful Pink fundraiser game and raised \$700.
- The Atom C Girls won the Silver medal in Stratford and were able to win Gold in the B.A.D. tourney. They placed in the top division of WOGHL after a strong regular season. They also very proudly raised \$1100 towards MHAL's Pink the Rink initiative.
- The Atom B Girls had an incredible season going undefeated in 3 tournaments and earning silver in a 4<sup>th</sup>. The girls came together and played like a true team, with stellar goaltending, all around defensive contributions and goals from every player. The girls did Lambeth proud at their Purple game and raised \$560 towards Mental Health.
- No Pee wee aged teams this season
- The Bantam C team was put together with 3 Pee wee aged players and 7 players new to Lambeth Hockey combining with 6 returning players to make up a full bench of 14 skaters and 2 goalies. They fought their way to 3 semi-finals at tournaments. The highlight of the season was a successful Purple fundraiser game donating \$1300 to First Responders.
- The Bantam B girls had an incredible 46-14-8 season. Won Oakville tourney Gold! Won St.Catherines tourney Gold! Lost in tourney finals of both Guelph and BAD. Before the season stoppage, this team made up of 100% Lambeth returnees qualified for Provincials for the 5<sup>th</sup> consecutive season. Lower Lakes West Division Champs. Season highlight was winning the deciding West Final game in a shootout thriller over Sarnia to earn back to back Lower Lakes Championship Weekend entry. They also raised \$740 in the Purple mental health initiative.
- The Midget C girls had a very respectful and fun season made up of almost all 2004 born first year U18's. They earned Silver at BAD tourney, won Gold at St.Thomas tourney and qualified for Provincials! They also raised \$785 in their Purple game.
- The Midget B girls also had an incredible season with a 43-12-3 record. First place in Lower Lakes West Division. Tourney Gold in Buffalo! Tourney Gold in Guelph! And Tourney Gold in Woodstock! They had a successful Purple game supporting our Mental Health initiative. They qualified for Provincials. They were 1 win away from being West Division champs when the season was stopped.



# Girls Hockey Report

In closing, I think the success of our girls program is second to nobody in Ontario with a comparable amount of teams. We are truly well represented wherever we play and even though we are hearing “where the heck is Lambeth?” all too often, there is no denying the opposing teams know exactly what we are about and that they are in for a true test game in and game out.

The future of our girls program is very bright with our grass roots IP programs having lots of girls playing and our U8 and U10 teams having great success.

If return to play happens we will have 2 U18 teams with a potential 34 skaters returning, marking the first time in MHAL Girls hockey history that we will have ZERO imports at an age level. Our U18 program will be very strong for at least 4 more seasons. Our 2006 born U14's will be making another run at Provincial supremacy. We will welcome the U12 (PW) back with enough girls graduating from U10 to field at least 1 team. We will have a nice amount of players at both U8 & U10 as well.

Let's all cross our fingers that we have some sort of season to return to.
